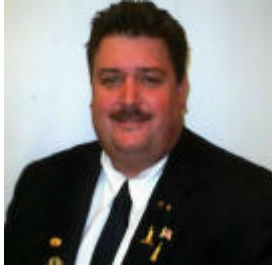

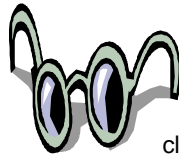

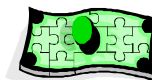
have been held on Sept. 14th. In

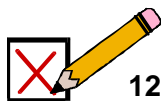

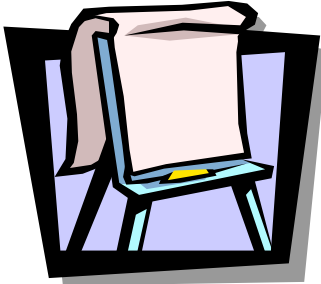
